Virtual Meeting
Instructions:

A short video regarding virtual meetings was played for attendees. The Chair provided information on internet and phone access for today's virtual meeting and announced that today's meeting was being recorded and that the recording will be posted on the Board's web page.

Call to Order:

The Chair took roll call of the Board members, noting that the Vice Chair was excused.

In accordance with Act 220, SLH 2021, all Board members attending virtually confirmed that they were alone in their nonpublic location.

After taking roll, quorum was established, and the meeting was called to order at 9:07 a.m.

Chair's Report:

Announcements

The Chair introduced Rebecca Moore who is a practicing RN in Kona, stating this is her first official Board meeting as a Board member.

Ms. Moore thanked the Chair and stated she is looking forward to serving on this Board.

Minutes:

Approval of the Executive Session Minutes of the August 1, 2024 Meeting and the Open and Executive Session Minutes of the September 5, 2024 Meeting

The Chair stated deferral of approval of the executive session minutes of the August 1, 2024 and September 5, 2024 meetings.

Upon a motion by Mr. Kuo, seconded by Mr. Aratani, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the open session minutes of the September 5, 2024 meeting.

Executive Officer's
Report:

Seventeenth Proclamation Relating to Wildfires

EO Fukunaga reported the Seventeenth Proclamation Relating to Wildfires was issued on September 17, 2024, which is set to expire

on November 16, 2024, unless terminated or superseded by a separate proclamation.

Correspondence

Email inquiry from Tani-Ann Iida, dated September 4, 2024 regarding best practices of RNs delivering pathology lab results to patients and requesting the Board to clarify on its website to include RNs in the link to the Scope of Practice Guidelines from the National Council of State Board of Nursing.

EO Fukunaga read the email which was received from Tani-Ann Iida, as follows:

We thank the State Board of Nursing for its discussion on Ms. Kimberly Gibu's letter regarding reading lab results to patients. This is a second follow up email as we received no response to our previous email, and are concerned that the letter previously submitted by our Union on our behalf was not mentioned nor addressed during that meeting, nor was the attachment to the National Council of the State Boards of Nursing Scope of Practice Guideline. We would also like to let you know that 2 of us were unable to access the meeting's "Raise your hand" feature to participate in the zoom meeting, perhaps because we were on Macintosh computers, so wanted you to be aware of a possible technology issue with your Zoom setup.

We present this information to give you a fuller picture of the change being proposed.

CURRENT and ORTHODOX care:

+Cancer Pathology result is sent to a GEN SURG RN who makes a GEN SURG consult appointment and advises PCP by electronic message. PCP calls patient to advise new cancer diagnosis, support patient and family by answering questions, advise GEN SURG appt date

PROPOSED, UNORTHODOX CARE

+Cancer Pathology result, any staff RN (who may have no relationship with the patient) to call patient following a boilerplate script, advise new cancer diagnosis, direct patient to read online resources about cancer and about GEN SURG appointment.

We understand from the Board's discussion that we may read the patient their positive cancer pathology report. As a point of clarification, as patient's can read their own pathology results via their online health record since the passage of the CARES Act of 2020, that is a misleading question. What we are really asking is if it's the best practice by Nursing Standards, and orthodox community expectations for a staff RN not versed in the technical details of the pathology lab result in question, to relay that information to a patient especially when it contains a traumatic diagnosis, and should non-provider RN's really be the staff to announce a new cancer diagnosis to a patient without being able to further support them.

We know of nowhere in our healthcare community where Staff RNs are expected to give patients their new cancer diagnosis, rather than have their medical (or covering) provider review this with the patient to be able to answer further lab, care and prognosis questions. However, we Staff RN's do not know technicalities about pathology result details, nor how to counsel and support patients about their new cancer diagnosis at the time of the call. We are not Oncology nurses nor providers such as an APRN, PA or MD.

Furthermore, there is no streamlining nor time -saving to anyone and DOES NOT BENEFIT THE PATIENT as rather than have the ordering physician advise the patient of their cancer diagnosis, and provide time for the patient and their family to ask questions, the patient will be just be read the same information viewable online and directed by the unknown RN to view online reference material before seeing a General Surgeon. We fail to see how this will streamline care as it will leave patients confused, and with more questions than answers right at the time of receiving their cancer diagnosis. Frankly, this truly lacks empathy for the patient. We are advocating for our patients that removal of the ordering physician from this process is not in their best interest. Streamlining of processes should not lead to LESS patient care from the ordering provider.

We understand that our particular Nursing Standard of Care questions may be beyond the parameters that the State Board of Nursing will advise on, as indicated in the recent online meeting discussion. we ask for a deeper discussion though, because lack of clarity may undermine Nursing

Scope of practice and our ability to advocate for our patients under ANA Nursing Standards of Care. Our ability to act as advocates is part of us practicing at our highest level.

We also request the State Board of Nursing clarify it's website to include Registered Nurses in the link to the Scope of Practice Guidelines from the National Council of the State Boards of Nursing:

Please also advise us if the Board is aware of any evidence base for this unorthodox change, as we cannot find any in our research.

The Chair asked if there was anyone attending wishing to testify on this specific agenda item.

Staff reported that Tani-Ann Iida raised her hand.

Ms. Iida introduced herself as a representative of four nurses from Kaiser. She stated that she and others have spoken to individuals in the community: patients, local healthcare administrators, providers, and nurses and all have questioned how this new process will benefit patients. Ms. Iida specifically questioned how the removal of a provider from establishing a medical diagnosis in light of the patient's medical and psychological history would be beneficial for the patient. She added that patients pay a lot of money for their medical care and will not be happy that their doctor is not willing to call them about their new cancer diagnosis.

Ms. Iida noted that the pathology report presented at the last meeting was very straightforward that indicated invasive carcinoma in situ. She clarified that the pathology reports can be quite complex, nuancing that although the report may contain the word, "carcinoma", it may not actually be cancer. "Lobular carcinoma in situ" for example, is not considered a cancer. Ms. Iida stated that pathology reports are not as simple as they seem and may contain other pathology terms about a finding that an RN cannot interpret to a patient. She reiterated that she was confused as to how this process would benefit the patient.

The Chair thanked Ms. Iida for her testimony and asked Ms. Iida to clarify her request to the Board.

Ms. Iida replied that she understands that the Board had previously clarified that a RN may read a patient their pathology report, however, she felt that the RNs are now expected to establish a medical diagnosis instead of the provider. She also felt that the process does not meet the standard of care in advocating for patients. She asked whether managers could be referred to the National Council of State Boards of Nursing scope of practice process to make it easier for everyone. Ms. Iida stated that all of the steps are in there that should be done before a new process like this is put out.

The Chair asked Ms. Iida whether she understood that reading a diagnosis is within the nursing scope of practice. She stated she was confused about what the standards and scope of practice consider a nursing diagnosis. She added that it is not thoroughly outside the purview of a nurse to make any nursing diagnosis.

The Chair commented that she wasn't clear about what Ms. Iida was asking. Ms. Iida's letter has already confirmed that: the Board has clarified the scope of practice inquiry, that the Board's purview does not extend to commenting on facility policy, that the job of the Board is to interpret legislation and rules related to the regulation of nursing practice and provide guidance as to whether or not something is or is not within the nursing scope of practice as defined by statute. The Chair asked Ms. Iida what she is asking the Board to discuss.

Ms. Iida replied that she understood that RNs can read a patient their pathology report or any other abnormal result; which the patient can already see. She stated that she felt like it is right on the edge of a RNs scope of practice to take a complex pathology report and informing a patient that they have breast cancer when that may not actually be breast cancer based on just the terminology in the report. Ms. Iida stated that she believed she was now establishing a medical diagnosis based on the abnormal result; she stated that this would be in the scope of an APRN not an RN.

The Chair stated that she was confused as to the circumstance in which an RN would receive an ambiguous indication of a cancer diagnosis and would result in the RN informing the patient of their cancer diagnosis.

Ms. Iida replied that lobular carcinoma in situ for example, may be a result. She anticipates that the patient's next question will be to ask whether they have cancer. She stated that based on this report that indicates that the patient has carcinoma, she is being told that she may tell the patient they have cancer. However, when the patient goes to their doctor they may say, "well may you do, maybe you don't."

Ms. Boyer asked whether there is an opportunity for follow-up appointments based on the information the RN provides.

Ms. Iida replied that the current procedure is that the RN informs the patient that they have cancer but may not explain any of the terminology in the pathology report. They are to be told that they have a health general surgery appointment, which is generally in about 7 to 10 days and if they want, the RN is to refer them to online sources to read about the cancer.

Mr. Kuo asked whether reviewing another report, for example, giving someone a positive result of a pregnancy; is that the same as diagnosing a pregnancy? Mr. Kuo felt that this isn't the case. He continued that he felt that it is providing information to a patient to start to make the best decisions themselves. He stated that he believes that this issue is not related to nursing scope, but rather a policy issue with the organization and the union.

Ms. Iida replied that in the statute, there is a reference to the scope which is the law and the standards of care which are the guard rails nurses rely on to know what safe and quality patient care is. She added that there are different types of test results that patients can get; some are very and clear and some are very complex. She conceded that it may be that the scope does not change regardless of how complex a test result may be. However, she questioned about the standards of care; who do the nurses consult for this portion of her inquiry?

Ms. Shields-Hanson stated that she understands the discomfort of this situation but added that as an RN, if there is something that she is asked to do that is not at the highest quality of care possible, she is going to discuss that with the ordering physician. She agreed with Mr. Kuo, stating that she does not feel that this is a scope of practice issue and that it is a communication issue between the agency and what the RNs are being asked to perform. She stated that the discussion needs to be with whoever has written the policy.

Ms. Iida replied that the NCSBN Scope of Practice Guidelines have been provided.

Mr. Kuo stated that he felt that it is very appropriate to provide that information to upper management to better guide the conversation. He noted that the issue still rests with that conversation.

Ms. Iida asked if the nurses go through all of those steps and the RNs are still uncomfortable as it would not be providing a quality care to patients, they should not proceed.

The Chair replied that that would be correct. The Chair qualified her response by adding that whether or not there are consequences for making that decision within Ms. Iida's organization is not anything that the Board is a position to comment on.

DAG Wong clarified that the Board takes no comment and takes no position on how nurses should proceed in this situation as this is a private dispute.

Ms. Iida stated that she and her fellow nurses were confused as to where to go for support for standards of care, despite the history and volume of information provided by the American Nurses Association and the NCSBN.

The Chair responded that one of the challenges that she is having with the reference to the standard of care is that Ms. Iida has not identified what standard of care this procedure is violating.

Ms. Iida replied that the code of ethics and the American Nursing Association's Standards of Care is something that could be provided to the Board. However, it has already been established that the Board will not be ruling on this particular issue.

The Chair clarified that the NCSBN Model Act, which does define the nursing scope of practice, is incorporated into HRS Chapter 457. The Chair also confirmed that the ANA's scope for standards or practice is not incorporated into the law. She further commented that the extent to which these standards are used in a nurse's practice as an individual nurse, it is expected to guide a nurse's ethical practice. However, it does not fall within the purview of the Board to determine whether or not a nurse is adhering to the standards of practice.

Ms. Iida asked whether she was understanding correctly that a nurse may use the NCSBN scope of practice guide to help guide the conversation, but in the end it'll be for the nurse to figure out whether to go forward or not.

The Chair replied that it is the individuals' decision about how they engage in their practice as a nurse.

Staff reported that Sean raised his hand.

Sean Kim introduced himself as the attorney for the union that represents Kaiser and the Director for Field Services for the union. Mr. Kim stated that one of the areas of concern that the union has is that there is a difference between reading the test results and giving a diagnosis based on what those test results show. He added that he understands the Board's position that the nurses can read the tests results, but that they don't necessarily agree. Another concern that the nurses have shared is that Kaiser has repeatedly told the nurses and the union that if the test result uses the word, "carcinoma" that they want the nurses to tell the patients that they have cancer. Mr. Kim echoed Ms. Iida that there are some results that use the word, "carcinoma" that are not cancers.

Mr. Kim stated that he just wants to make sure that the Board is clear that what they are saying is that the nurses can read the test results and that they are not going as far as to say that the nurses can say to the patient that they have cancer.

The Chair asked for confirmation that Mr. Kim is saying that Kaiser has a facility policy that if a test result or pathology result comes back positive for carcinoma, that there is a cancer diagnosis.

Mr. Kim clarified that Kaiser has said that the diagnosis of cancer is just a lay term for the term, "carcinoma". He added that they strenuously disagree with that. He stated that if a test result comes back and says that whatever has been tested is some form of carcinoma, Kaiser wants the nurses to say to the patient that they have a positive test for cancer. Mr. Kim stated that there is a difference between reading a test result and making a diagnosis that the test result shows that it's cancerous.

Mr. Kim addressed the comments regarding a pregnancy test, stating that a nurse can say that a pregnancy test came back positive, but he doesn't think that a nurse would say a pregnancy test came back positive and guarantee that a patient is pregnant because you can't have false positives. He added that the Union's

strong concern is making sure that the nurses stay within their scope of practice. If the Board's decision was that a nurse can read test results that one thing, but if the Board's decision is that the nurse can then take the test result and come up with the diagnosis of cancer then that is something else.

Ms. Boyer asked for confirmation on whether there was a script that's been provided by the primary care team with various results.

Mr. Kim responded that it is his understanding that Kaiser has come up with a script. When this issue was first discussed, the union was given assurances that they would be able to assist in rewriting this script and the union has not been consulted concerning any of that. His current understanding is that Kaiser is now working directly with the RNs to come up with this script as this is not something that they need to bargain with the union.

Mr. Kim stated that he understands that the Board issue a nonbinding decision saying that RNs can read test results. He asked whether the Board is saying, in terms of protecting our nurses' license, that if the test results contains the word, "carcinoma", they can say thence render a diagnosis of cancer.

Executive
Session:

At 9:32 a.m., upon a motion by Mr. Kuo, seconded by Mr. Aratani, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move into executive session in accordance with HRS §92-4 and §92-5(a) (4) "To consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities".

Upon a motion by Mr. Kuo, seconded by Mr. Aratani, it was voted on and unanimously carried to move out of executive session at 9:45 a.m.

The Chair thanked the public for their patience, explaining that the stated that the Board's consulted is attorney regarding its purview to comment on this matter.

Following the discussion in open session and testimony, the Board made three statements regarding this issue:

- 1) Nothing of the new information provided here today changes the Board's previous informal opinion, that reading a pathology report or test result of any kind is within a nursing scope of practice.

- 2) The Board finds that reading a script that contains a test result is not equivalent to making a diagnosis. The Board expects that the diagnosis was made and incorporated into the script and reading it is not the same thing as making that diagnosis.
- 3) We strongly encourage the nurses to continue to engage in conversation with Kaiser and your facility to arrive at a script that is amenable and acceptable to everyone; in order to provide quality patient care.

The Chair noted that this was an informal opinion of the Board, based solely on the information provided in the inquiry and today's discussion; it is not an official opinion or decision, and therefore is not to be viewed as binding on the Board or the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs.

Mr. Kim asked for clarification on the Board's second statement. Mr. Kim asked if Kaiser prepares a script for the nurses to read that says, "you have cancer"; that is not a diagnosis that a nurse is making and the nurse is not acting outside of their scope of practice?

The Chair confirmed that that is the Board's opinion.

Mr. Kim asked for assurances that a nurse has not acted outside of their scope of practice in instances where a patient files a complaint against a nurse who has read a script telling the patient they have cancer, but the patient is later informed by a provider that they do not have cancer.

The Chair stated that she was unsure of how to respond to that question because there are some assumptions that she is prepared to acknowledge.

Mr. Kim clarified that he is trying to ensure that the nurse's license is protected. He asked in cases where a nurse is using the word, "cancer" and the doctor or provider has not used that term, will the nurse be charged with practicing outside their scope?

The Chair reiterated the Board's second statement which is that a nurse will read a prepared script, that diagnosis is coming from somewhere other than the nurse; that nurse is not making a diagnosis, they are reading a script that contains a diagnosis.

Mr. Kim stated that they will now engage Kaiser and continue discussions.

The Chair thanked Mr. Kim for his testimony.

Ms. Iida raised her hand.

Ms. Iida asked whether it is within the scope of practice of a staff RN to interpret a complex abnormal pathology result into a medical diagnosis.

The Chair replied, "no".

Ms. Iida stated that she feels like that is what is being asked of herself and her fellow RNs.

The Chair replied that they are being asked to read a script.

Ms. Iida stated that they removed the provider from confirming the diagnosis.

The Chair stated that they have now broached the part where the RNs have to work out the particulars of how that script is written with their facility. Based on the information that is available, the Board has determined that reading a test result is within the nursing scope of practice and that reading a script that contains a diagnosis is not the same thing as making a diagnosis. The Chair commented that Ms. Iida and her fellow RNs will need to work with her facility to arrive at a script that is amenable to everyone. She added that the Board is not in a position to make any more elaborate or detailed comments on this matter.

Ms. Iida thanked the Board.

The Chair thanked everyone for their testimony.
