Virtual Meeting
Instructions:

A short video regarding virtual meetings was played for attendees. The Chair provided information on internet and phone access for today's virtual meeting and announced that today's meeting was being recorded and that the recording will be posted on the Board's web page.

Call to Order:

The Vice Chair took roll call of the Board members. Ms. Shields-Hanson and Mr. Kuo noted that they were present in person.

In accordance with Act 220, SLH 2021, Mr. Dunbar, Mr. Aratani, Ms. Moore, and the Vice Chair virtually confirmed that they were alone in a nonpublic location.

After taking roll, quorum was established, and the meeting was called to order at 9:08 a.m.

After the Vice Chair read the meeting instructions, the Chair entered the meeting at 9:11 a.m.

Chair's Report:

Announcements

The Chair did not have any announcements.

Report on the 2025 NCSBN Annual Conference

The Chair attended the 2025 NCSBN Annual Conference in Chicago alongside Mr. Aratani. The Chair gave the following report on the conference:

Nurse Licensure Compact Meeting – 8/12/2025

- Government Affairs Update
 - 9 introductions of NLC legislation in 2025 season in AK, DC, HI, IL, MI, MN, NV, NY, OR; none of the bills passed.
 - CA was the only non-compact state in which there was no introduction of legislation to join.
 - There is strong support for joining the NLC in IL
 - Bill included extra-compact language that mirrored WA to require employers to require nurses working in the state under their multistate privilege to submit demographic survey data and meet continuing education requirements.

- In MI, the legislative session was still ongoing at the time of the NLC meeting. The MI chapter of the American Nurses Association endorsed joining. Labor unions, including the UAW testified in opposition.
- Lots of marketing produced by NCSBN/NLC to improve public awareness and nurses' perception of the NLC in IL and MI.
- Rules Committee Update
 - Two common issues related to NLC states' compliance with the NLC rules:
 - A nurse who is upgrading their license from a single state to a multistate is required to undergo a new criminal background check.
 - A nurse who is applying for multistate licensure in a new primary state of residence (PSOR) is eligible for licensure by endorsement even if they do not have an active license in another jurisdiction.
 - New educational website will be made available to help support NLC states' understanding of the rules.
 - There is an upcoming review of the rules related to the NLC; one matter to be considered is whether an LPN who did not complete an LPN program meets the eligibility criteria for multistate licensure. Member states have provided feedback which is currently being considered by the rules committee.
- Compliance Committee Update
 - Completing a redesign of a compliance toolkit to assist states in self-auditing their compliance with the rules of the NLC when determining applicant eligibility for multistate licensure.
- Other NLC Notes
 - Estimated 2.5 million nurses in the U.S. hold a multistate license
 - 27 states issue multistate licenses to any eligible resident in their state by default (rather than issuing a multistate license as an optional upgrade to the single state license)

Meeting of the NCSBN Delegate Assembly – 8/13/2025–8/15/2025

- NCLEX Related Updates:
 - There was no update about the likely launch date for remote proctoring.

- The Delegate Assembly voted to approve the 2026 NCLEX-PN and NCLEX-RN test plans which describe the composition of the test by question type and subject matter. The test plan did not change from what is currently being used.
- The current NCLEX practice analysis reports for LPNs and RNs describe the correspondence between the content of the NCLEX exams and the characteristics of new graduate nurses' initial employment.
- The Treasurer of the NCSBN Board of Directors reported that given the rising cost of doing business, there will likely be a proposal from the finance committee to the Delegate Assembly to increase the cost of the NCLEX exam.
 - The proposal will not be presented before the August 2026 meeting of the Delegate Assembly.
 - The last price increase on the NCLEX happened in 2000 when the Delegate Assembly voted to raise the price from \$160 to \$200.
- Model Act and Rules Committee Update
 - The committee is reviewing feedback provided by NCSBN members on the revision and considering whether they need to be further revised.
 - The committee will be doing additional outreach at next year's NCSBN midyear meeting (March 13-16 in Phoenix, AZ).
 - A final draft of the revised model act and rules will likely come before the Delegate assembly for a vote at the 2026 annual meeting.
- Member Engagement Update
 - Revisions are ongoing for the EO succession toolkit; going into the last phase of work.
 - 2026 NCSBN Committee applications are open until September 9 for three committees (see Committee webpage on NCSBN website for more details):
 - New: Regulatory Metrics Committee
 - New: Substance Use Disorder Resources Committee
 - NCLEX Item Review Subcommittee
- Presentation on APRN Education
 - 50% of nursing regulatory bodies in the U.S. regulate APRN education

- NRBs often face pressure for joint regulation with physicians
- NCSBN maintains that boards of nursing should be the sole regulators of APRN practice including the regulation of APRN education
- Education related highlights from the four APRN roles:
- CRNA
 - Recent decline in CRNA certification exam test takers; likely due to a nationwide shift from MSN to DNP as the minimum education program for CRNAs.
 - All U.S. CRNA programs are DNP programs as of 2022.
 - 154 programs in the U.S. provide certification-eligible CRNA education.
 - The average CRNA program provides more than the 600 clinical practice hours required for CRNA certification.
 - Primary challenge to educational capacity in CRNA programs is competition for clinical placements and the very large difference in average compensation between nursing faculty and clinical CRNA roles (also noted as primary capacity challenges for NP programs).
- NP
 - 35% increase in the number of U.S. NP programs between 2020 and 2024.
 - Enrollment in NP programs has increased in that same period, largely due to high demand for psychiatric-mental health NP education and the pursuit of DNP education for masters-prepared NPs.
 - Education capacity limitations are most commonly clinical placement and faculty shortages.
 - Schools often have the challenge of needing more faculty to expand but being unable to secure funding to increase the number of funded faculty lines.
 - U.S. NP programs require significantly fewer clinical hours than NP programs in Australia and Canada.
 - The National Task Force for Quality Nurse Practitioner Education standards call for a minimum of 750 clinical practice hours. Currently 40-53% of NP programs meet that minimum.
 - There is a positive correlation between the number

of clinical hours in an NP program and NP cert exam pass rates independent of the type of degree the program offers (MSN vs. DNP).

- More studies are necessary to determine the extent to which and the appropriate manner in which simulation can substitute for direct patient care clinical hours.
- CNM
 - The nation's maternal healthcare provider workforce is shrinking; rural hospitals are closing which contributes to maternal healthcare deserts.
 - The regulatory environment for midwifery is complicated:
 - CNMs and CMs have similar scopes of practice but are licensed differently and have different educational programs (CM programs don't contain nursing content).
 - Certified Professional Midwives are a third type of midwife whose scope only allows them to practice outside of hospitals, and their practice is limited to caring for women during pregnancy through birth.
 - CNMs and CMs can provide primary women's healthcare.
 - The CNM certifying body strongly recommends that all types of midwifery should be regulated by the same body, preferably boards of nursing.
 - The certifying body strongly opposes requiring the DNP for midwives as it would create a barrier to entry into the workforce. In other developed nations, there are no observable differences in patient outcomes between masters-prepared and doctoral-prepared midwives.
 - There is a call for more post-graduate midwifery programs to support APRNs, PAs, and other types of providers in accessing midwifery education.
- CNS
 - There has been an overall decline in U.S. CNS programs; rebound of MSN programs.
 - Sharpest decline is among CNS programs that provide 100% face-to-face instruction.
 - CNS certifying body relies heavily on NCSBN's description of the scope of practice for a CNS as the scope varies widely between states.
 - Preceptors feel ill-prepared to support CNS students as they are experts in their practice but

not trained as educators.

The Chair asked if Mr. Aratani had anything to add based on his attendance at the meeting.

Mr. Aratani noted that they had attended a session on artificial intelligence in healthcare regulation, which examined how AI could support regulatory functions by drafting policies, monitoring compliance, and predicting trends. The presenters also discussed the risk of error due to flawed data or prompts and stressed the importance of setting guardrails. The presenters encouraged the use of AI and noted that AI was committing less mistakes over time. Mr. Aratani also noted that he attended a session with Matthew Luhn, who used to be with Pixar, about how storytelling makes people remember more information than statistics.

EO Pang said that he had previously understood that NCSBN intended to roll out NCLEX remote proctoring in 2026. However, based on the Chair's report, it sounded like NCSBN did not have a planned date to roll out remote proctoring. The Chair agreed with EO Pang's interpretation and added that she spoke with the director of the NCLEX, who said that they had nothing further to share at this time.

Mr. Dunbar asked how a Board member could join an NCSBN committee if they were interested. EO Pang said he did not know, but he believed that the Board member could directly contact NCSBN to express interest, and that he could also set Mr. Dunbar up to speak with someone at NCSBN.

**Approval of the Open and Executive Session Minutes of the
August 7, 2025 Meeting**

The Chair suggested nonsubstantive edits to the open session minutes of the August 7, 2025 meeting, noting that Laura Reichhardt's title was "Director" rather than "President".

Upon a motion by Mr. Kuo, seconded by Ms. Shields-Hanson, it was voted on and unanimously carried to approve the open and executive session minutes of the August 7, 2025 meeting with the Chair's suggested edits.

Proposed
amendments to
healthcare-

EO Pang noted that, as discussed at the August Board meeting, a working group had been convened to amend the HRS, particularly involving statutes related to healthcare professionals. A proposed

related HRS

amendment aimed to address barriers in healthcare-related statutes by creating a flexible definition of "qualified healthcare professional" that could be inserted across various statutes.

EO Pang noted two places in HRS 457, the Nursing statute, where a "qualified healthcare professional" definition could potentially be inserted:

HRS 457-2. Definitions.

"The practice of nursing as a licensed practical nurse" *[Repeal and reenactment on July 1, 2017 by L 2012, c 255, §5 deleted by L 2016, c 2, §2.]* means the performance of those acts commensurate with the required educational preparation and demonstrated competency of the individual, whereby the individual shall be accountable and responsible to the consumer for the quality of nursing care rendered. The foregoing may include, but shall not be limited to: implementation of basic nursing procedures in the plan of care; observing and caring for individuals at all levels of the health spectrum, giving counsel and acting to safeguard life and health and functioning as a part of the health care team, **under the direction of a dentist, physician, osteopathic physician, registered nurse, or podiatrist licensed in accordance with chapter 448, 453, 457, or 463E, or under the orders of a physician assistant licensed pursuant to chapter 453, practicing with physician supervision as required by chapter 453, and acting as the agent of the supervising physician;** administration of treatment and medication as prescribed; promotion of health maintenance of individuals, families, or groups; or teaching and supervision of auxiliary personnel.

"The practice of nursing as a registered nurse" *[Repeal and reenactment on July 1, 2017 by L 2012, c 255, §5 deleted by L 2016, c 2, §2.]* means the performance of professional services commensurate with the educational preparation and demonstrated competency of the individual having specialized knowledge, judgment, and skill based on the principles of the biological, physical, behavioral, and sociological sciences and nursing theory, whereby the individual shall be accountable and responsible to the consumer for the quality of nursing care rendered. The foregoing may include but shall not be limited to observation, assessment, development, implementation, and evaluation of a plan of care, health counseling, supervision and teaching of other personnel, and teaching of individuals, families, and groups in any stage of health or illness; administration, supervision, coordination, delegation, and evaluation of nursing practice; provision of health care to the patient in collaboration with other members of the health care team as

autonomous health care professionals providing the nursing component of health care; or use of reasonable judgment in carrying out prescribed medical orders of a licensed dentist, physician, osteopathic physician, or podiatrist licensed in accordance with chapter 448, 453, or 463E; orders of an advanced practice registered nurse licensed in accordance with this chapter; or the orders of a physician assistant licensed pursuant to chapter 453, practicing with physician supervision as required by chapter 453, and acting as the agent of the supervising physician.

[§457-9.2] Continuing competency requirements; exemptions; extensions; records retention; audit.

(c) The board may extend the deadline for compliance with the continuing competency requirements and shall consider each case on an individual basis. Prior to the expiration of the license, a nurse licensee may submit a written request for an extension and any documentation requested by the board to substantiate the reason for the extension of the deadline for compliance with the continuing competency requirements of this section, based on the following circumstances:

(1) Illness, as certified by a physician or osteopathic physician licensed under chapter 453 or advanced practice registered nurse licensed under chapter 457 in the jurisdiction in which the licensee was treated; or [...]

Mr. Dunbar noted that under HRS 457-2's definition of "practice of nursing as a licensed practical nurse," an advanced practice registered nurse was not listed as one of the providers, but a physician assistant was. Meanwhile, under HRS 457-2's definition of "practice of nursing as a registered nurse," an APRN was listed. He was curious as to why an APRN would not be listed as being able to direct the nursing practice of LPNs, given the other providers listed.

The Chair noted that the "qualified healthcare professional" definition could assist with this issue. EO Pang added that the LPN definition included taking directions from an RN, and so he wondered if that would also include taking directions from an APRN. Mr. Dunbar asked if there was an opportunity to make recommendations on the verbiage. The Chair said that this language was what was currently listed in the HRS.

Ms. Reichhardt asked if she could speak and was invited by the Board to do so. She thanked the Board for its review of this matter. She noted that the working group had gone through the HRS with

the intention of leaving the scope of practice sections alone. However, if there was any recommendation to add additional language, that was the intention of the whole project, so that all proposed changes would be merged in a single legislative initiative.

EO Pang noted that in the document he provided the Board, he did not provide exact recommendations on where the "qualified healthcare professional" definition could be inserted. However, he noted that the Board seemed OK with the general intent of inserting the "qualified healthcare professional" definition in these general areas of HRS 457-2.

The Chair asked if there was any public testimony on this agenda item. Staff indicated that there was none.

Executive Officer's **Twenty-Fifth Proclamation Relating to Wildfires**
Report:

EO Pang stated that the twenty-fifth proclamation was issued on August 22, 2025 with an extension until October 21, 2025, unless terminated or superseded by separate proclamation.

Mr. Dunbar asked why the proclamation was continuing in light of the wildfires no longer being an active problem.

Mr. Aratani noted that sometimes emergency proclamations continue because of the use of funding. Mr. Dunbar asked if Mr. Aratani was referring to state funding, or federal funding such as FEMA. Mr. Aratani said both. Procurement was often an issue, which was why proclamations could continue even though the inciting event had passed.

Mr. Dunbar asked for clarification as to whether the proclamation allowed for the rapid onset licensure of healthcare providers on Maui. EO Pang clarified that the proclamation did not allow for licensure, but rather for waiver of licensure for nurses already licensed out-of-state with current and active licensure. The Vice Chair added that the proclamation applied to the whole state and not just Maui.

DAG Wong added that the twenty-fifth proclamation included language that the emergency proclamation was continuing in light of wildfires that had occurred as recently as July 2025. Therefore, the proclamation was not only contemplating the wildfires on Maui.

Reports: **Hawai'i State Center for Nursing – Laura Reichhardt, Director**

Ms. Reichhardt reported that Hawaii is the first state in the nation to have a statewide nurse residency program collaborative, which started in 2012 and expanded in 2023 to be a transition to practice program. That program had over 2,000 participants with a 97% retention rate in the first year, which was notable given that across the nation, a quarter of nurses left the workforce after their first nursing job. When there was dedicated funding for hospitals, they saw an outsized participation from the outer islands, where there were more significant nursing workforce inadequacies than Oahu. 64% of the participants in these training programs were from neighbor islands when there was funding, and 34% of the participants were from neighbor islands when there was not funding.

She noted that despite the tendency towards hyperbole in describing the nursing workforce, i.e. “there are no new jobs for grads,” there were 16 hospitals across the state who were welcoming new grads in a strong and supportive way to help graduates stay in their careers.

- They had a survey out, Kuleana Nursing for Advocacy, for nursing across the state in preparation of the next legislative session

- Conference on September 27 which would include three nurse excellence awards
