Condominium Disputes

Is your condominium having conflicts? In need of a third-party condominium law expert to evaluate the situation? Subsidized mediation is available to every condominium owner and board member in a registered association. Meditation is mandatory for most disputes and the state will subsidize up to \$3,000 worth of evaluative mediation with a condominium law expert. Legislative Update

The Governor signed one condominium related bill into law, <u>Act 62, SLH 2022</u>. This Act amends a variety of governance sections ranging from meetings, reserve requirements, amending governing documents, as well as now requiring developers to include more information on maintenance fees.
