Call to
Order:

The meeting was called to order at 1:03 p.m., at which time quorum was established.

Introduction of
Guests:

Vice-Chair Halford greeted the meeting guests. Guests, Board members, and staff introduced themselves.

Approval of the
June 13, 2019,
Minutes:

It was moved by Dr. Young, seconded by Dr. Holt, and carried by a majority, with the exception of Dr. Fong, Dr. Takanishi, and Dr. Jaffe, who abstained from voting on this matter, to approve the minutes of the open session and the minutes of the executive session of the June 13, 2019, meeting as circulated.

Adjudicatory
Matters:

Vice-Chair Halford called for a recess from the meeting at 1:10 p.m. to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matter pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS:

- a. In the Matter of the License to Practice Medicine of Wesley K.W. Young, M.D.: MED 2012-5-L

At 1:13 p.m. the floor was opened for the parties to present their oral arguments.

Vice-Chair Halford commenced the proceedings. He explained to the parties that each party will be given a maximum of ten(10) minutes to present their oral arguments and five (5) minutes for rebuttal. After the parties have presented their oral arguments, the parties and meeting guests will be excused, and the Board will deliberate on the matter before voting on its decision.

William Harrison, Esq., representing Wesley K.W. Young, M.D. ("Respondent" or "Dr. Young"), addressed the Board first.

Mr. Harrison stated that this has been a long journey for his client, Dr. Young: it has been seven (7) years since the RICO investigation into this matter commenced. During this time, Dr. Young went through two (2) court trials, served his sentence, and did everything he could to rehabilitate himself by meeting all of the terms of his sentence. Dr. Young also did a lot of work to clear his tax matters.

Mr. Harrison brought it to the Board's attention that, during the hearings, Dr. Young was able to provide numerous letters of support from members of the community, including his patients. Mr. Harrison informed the Board that, even though his client has had some difficulties in life and made mistakes, he has atoned for his conduct and is trying to get past his mistakes.

Mr. Harrison stated he and Dr. Young respect the Hearings Officer's recommendation. However, had this matter been prosecuted and

resolved promptly, Dr. Young would have completed whatever the Board asked him to do well before 2019. Mr. Harrison asked the Board to consider whether, at this late junction, Dr. Young's license should be suspended. He suggested that the Board consider other alternatives such as probation or any other condition that might be appropriate and added that removing Dr. Young from his only source of income at this point of time does not make sense. Mr. Harrison quoted the Hearings Officer's Findings of Fact, Conclusion of Law, and Recommended Order; In the Matter of the License to Practice Medicine of Wesley K.W. Young, M.D.; MED-2012-5-L dated January 16, 2019, which states:

[A]nother important factor in not recommending a more severe sanction is that Respondent's criminal conviction and financial and tax difficulties are not related to patient harm or the unsafe practice of medicine. Rather, the evidence presented by Respondent showed that Respondent has demonstrated excellent clinical competence as an emergency room physician, and decades of devotion to quality patient care. Mr. Harrison concluded his oral arguments with a statement that, if punishment was needed, it had to have happened right away, instead of seven (7) years later.

Mark Nakamura, Esq., presented oral arguments on behalf of the Regulated Industries Complaints Office, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, State of Hawaii ("Petitioner").

Mr. Nakamura asked the Board that the recommended disciplinary sanctions be upheld for the following reasons:

- 1) Mr. Young committed serious and numerous violations of the licensing laws governing the practice of the medical profession in the State of Hawaii. Among the most egregious violations were conduct or practice contrary to the recognized standards of ethics governing of the medical profession in this State; as well as the conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal offence substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of a physician or osteopathic physician, notwithstanding any statutory provision to the contrary. The conduct in question is a domestic violence incident, when in the course of an argument Dr. Young head-butted his wife causing a fracture of her eye socket.
- 2) The Hearings Officer evaluated and correctly applied the law in the determination that Dr. Young did not report and misrepresented actions taken against him by HSMA. As stated in the Hearings Officer's Findings of Fact, Conclusion of Law, and Recommended Order; In the Matter of the License to

Practice Medicine of Wesley K.W. Young. M.D.; MED-2012-5-L dated January 16, 2019, "these facts show that Respondent was aware of the adverse action when he submitted his renewal applications on March 20, 2014, and February 17, 2016." (Page 9)

- 3) The Hearings Officer considered the matter carefully, took into consideration Dr. Young's progress, and recognized it. However, the consideration of that progress has to be balanced by the need for accountability and respect for the licensing laws.

Mr. Harrison responded to Mr. Nakamura's arguments. He stated that Dr. Young was not trying to hide anything from the Medical Board and argued that the language on the Board's renewal applications of what has to be reported regarding credentialing matters is vague and unclear. Mr. Harrison stated the Respondent objects to the proposal to take action against Dr. Young so long after the committed offence.

Vice-Chair Halford thanked the parties and asked the Board members if anyone had questions.

Dr. Jaffe asked whether a letter from HMSA notifying Dr. Young of termination of his credentialing and participating provider status was sent via certified mail.

Mr. Nakamura responded that the letter in question was, indeed, sent via certified mail.

Mr. Harrison informed the Board members that Dr. Young was incarcerated when the HMSA letter was sent and did not receive this letter.

Vice-Chair Halford thanked the parties, and at 1:27 p.m. the guests were excused from the meeting room.

At 1:39 p.m. the guests were invited back into the meeting room.

After discussion, it was moved by Dr. Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Young, and unanimously carried to approve the Hearings Officer's Recommended Order as the Board's Final Order.

Following the Board's review, deliberation, and decision on this matter pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS, Vice-Chair Halford announced that the Board reconvene to its regular Chapter 92, HRS, meeting at 1:43 p.m.
