Agenda: The agenda for this meeting was filed with the Office of the Lieutenant Governor and posted to the State Calendar, as required by §92-7(b), Hawaii Revised Statutes (“HRS”).

A short video was played to explain the meeting procedures and how members of the public could participate in the virtual meeting.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m., at which time quorum was established.

Chair Geimer-Flanders welcomed everyone to the meeting and proceeded with a roll call of the Board members. All Board members confirmed that they were present, with the exception of Geri Young, M.D., who was excused from the meeting.

Approval of the  
February 10, 2022,  
Minutes:

It was moved by Dr. Takanishi, seconded by Dr. Halford, and carried by the majority, with the exception of Dr. Dao who recused himself, to approve the meeting minutes of the executive session and the minutes of the open session of the February 10, 2022 meeting, as circulated.

Adjudicatory  
Matters:

Chair Geimer-Flanders called for a recess from the meeting at 1:12 p.m., to discuss and deliberate on the following adjudicatory matter pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS (Note: Board members and staff entered the Microsoft Teams meeting).

A. In the Matter of the License to Practice Medicine of Dennis I. Ayon, M.D.; MED-2010-109-L; Board's Final Order

After discussion, it was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Halford, and carried by the majority to approve Dr. Ayon's (aka Thomas Isadore, M.D.) request to remove the conditions placed on his license pursuant to the Board's Final Order dated December 8, 2016. The Board based its decision, in part, on a letter from Pu`ulu Lapa`au, the Hawaii Program for Healthcare Professionals, which states that "as of March 2, 2022, Dr. Isadore satisfied all our monitoring requirements and those made by the Hawaii Medical Board, in the Board's Final Order, written on December 8, 2016."

Following the Board's review, deliberation, and decision on these matters pursuant to Chapter 91, HRS, Chair Geimer-Flanders announced that the Board reconvene to its regular Chapter 92, HRS, meeting at 1:16 p.m. Board members and staff returned to the Zoom meeting.

Applications for  
License/  
Certification:

A. Applications:

It was moved by Dr. Holt, seconded by Dr. Jaffe, and unanimously carried to enter into executive session at 1:17 p.m., pursuant to HRS §92-5(a)(1), to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional licenses cited in HRS §26-9, and, pursuant to HRS §92-5(a)(4), to consult with the Board's attorney on questions and issues pertaining to the Board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities and liabilities. (Note: Board members and staff entered into Microsoft Teams):

(i) Physician (Permanent/Non-Endorsement):

(iii) Emergency Medical Personnel

a. Kelly Scott Halpin, EMT

It was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Takanishi, and unanimously carried to return to the open session meeting at 2:29 p.m. Board members and staff returned to the Zoom meeting.

(i) Physician (Permanent/Non-Endorsement):

a. Louie Mar Alviz Gangcuangco, M.D.

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Takanishi, seconded by Mr. Belcher, and unanimously carried, to issue a conditional approval letter to Dr. Gangcuangco, which notes that he has meet the education, examination, and training requirements for licensure. This letter will also note that this conditional approval does not allow him to practice medicine in the State until he is issued an appropriate visa authorizing him to work in the United States.

(ii) Physician Assistant

a. Andrew S. McIntyre, PA-C

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Fong, seconded by Dr. Takanishi, and unanimously carried, to approve Mr. McIntyre's application for certification.

(iii) Emergency Medical Personnel

a. Kelly Scott Halpin, EMT

After due consideration of the information received, it was moved by Dr. Jaffe, seconded by Mr. Belcher, and unanimously carried to defer Mr. Halpin's application to request additional information.

The Board based its decision on the following grounds of the Hawaii Revised Statutes ("HRS") and Hawaii Administrative Rules ("HAR"), which find factual support in the records and files of Mr. Halpin's application<sup>1</sup>:

HRS section 436B-19 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided by law, the licensing authority may refuse to renew, reinstate or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license for any one or more of the following acts or conditions on the part of the licensee or the applicant thereof:

\* \* \*

- (3) Being addicted to, dependent on, or a habitual user of a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine, hallucinogen, opium, or cocaine, or other drugs or derivatives of a similar nature;
- (7) Professional misconduct, incompetence, gross negligence, or manifest incapacity in the practice of the licensed profession or vocation;
- (12) Failure to comply, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the licensing authority deems the applicant or holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license; and
- (14) Criminal conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise, of a penal crime directly related to the

qualifications, functions, or duties of the licensed profession or vocation.

HAR section 16-85-112 provides that:

(a) In addition to any other acts or conditions provided in sections 436B-19 and 453-8, HRS, the board may refuse to renew, reinstate, or restore, or may deny, revoke, suspend, or condition in any manner, any license, certificate for any one or more of the following conditions:

\* \* \*

(1) Failure to comply with, observe, or adhere to any law in a manner such that the board deems the licensee or certificate holder to be an unfit or improper person to hold a license or certificate.

B. Ratifications:

(i) List

It was moved by Chair Geimer-Flanders, seconded by Dr. Egami, and unanimously carried to ratify the attached list of individuals for licensure or certification.

Legislation:

A. HB1575, HD2, RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

The Board discussed this bill.

The purposes of this bill are to: (1) expand the scope of practice for physician assistants; and (2) require a sampling of medical records, rather than all medical records, to be reviewed when physician assistants prescribe controlled substances.

The Board supports this bill.

B. HB1667, HD2/SB2592, SD1, RELATING TO HEALTH

The Board discussed this bill.

The purposes of these bills are to: (1) define "clinical laboratory director" to include certain physicians, licensed clinical laboratory scientists, and pharmacists-in-charge of pharmacies; and (2) amend the definition of "practice of pharmacy" to include the ordering and performing of certain Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments ("CLIA") waived tests.

Ms. Quiogue informed the members that the Senate Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection recommended passage of SB2592 with amendments, to include: (1) clarifying the

definition of “clinical laboratory director” to include advanced practice registered nurses for clinical laboratory tests or examinations classified a waived under the CLIA; and (2) making technical, non-substantive amendments for the purposes of clarity and consistency.

The Board will continue to track this measure.

C. HB1675, HD1, SB2729 RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS

The Board discussed this bill.

The purpose of this bill are to: (1) permit minors to consent to medical care and services related to the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of HIV; (2) specify that a minor, under certain circumstances, shall not be liable for payment associated with the diagnosis, treatment, or prevention of HIV; and (3) authorize physician assistants, in addition to physicians and advanced practice registered nurses, to render such medical care and services to minors.

The Board will continue to provide comments, appreciating the intent of the bill.

D. SB2645, SD1 RELATING TO ACCESS TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

The Board discussed this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to allow for standard telephone contacts for telehealth purposes related to behavior health services.

Ms. Quiogue advised the Board that the companion to SB2645, SD1, HB1708, was not heard. She went on to say that the Senate Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection amended this measure to: (1) amend section 1 of the bill; and (2) make technical, non-substantive amendments for the purpose of clarity and consistency.

The Board will continue to track SB2645, SD1.

E. HB1823, HD1/SB2680, SD1 RELATING TO HEALTH

The Board discussed these bills.

The purposes of these bills are to: (1) authorize advanced practice registered nurses, in addition to physicians, to practice medical aid in dying in accordance with their scope of practice and prescribing

authority; (2) authorize psychiatric mental health nurse practitioners and clinical nurse specialists, in addition to psychiatrists, psychologists, and clinical social workers, to provide counseling to a qualified patient; (3) reduce the mandatory waiting period between oral requests from twenty days to fifteen days; and (4) waive the mandatory waiting period for terminally ill individuals not expected to survive the mandatory waiting period.

Ms. Quiogue informed the members that HB1823, was amended as HD2 to add physician assistants to provide counseling services.

The Board voted to provide testimony appreciating the intent of the measure and offering comments that recognize the important role physician assistants have in healthcare.

F. HB2437, HD1 RELATING TO TAXATION

The Board discussed this bill.

The purposes of this bill are to: (1) establish a \$10,000 income tax credit for physicians, osteopathic physicians, and nurses who are licensed and actively practicing in the State; (2) require the Hawaii State Center for Nursing to report to the Legislature on impact and effect of the tax credit by December 31, 2024; and (3) have the measure sunset on December 31, 2025.

The Board will continue to track this measure.

G. SB2241, SD1 RELATING TO MEDICAL CARE FOR MINORS

The Board discussed this bill.

The purposes of this bill are to: (1) permit minors to consent to medical care related to the diagnosis or treatment of HIV or the prevention of HIV; (2) provide that a minor, under certain circumstances, shall not be liable for payment for treatment or prevention of HIV; (3) provide that a health insurer of a minor's parent, guardian, custodian, or spouse shall not notify the parent guardian, custodian, or spouse of the minor's treatment or prevention of HIV; and (4) authorize physician assistants, in addition to physicians and advanced practice registered nurses, to render medical care and services to minors.

The Board will continue to submit testimony appreciating the intent of the measure and providing comments.

H. SB 2442, SD1 RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

The Board discussed this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to streamline the records review process for physician assistants by including review of physician assistants' prescriptions for controlled substances.

Members were advised that the Senate Committee on Judiciary and Senate Committee on Commerce and Consumer Protection held a joint hearing and issued a SD2, which amended the measure by making technical, non-substantive amendments for the purposes of clarity and consistency.

The Board will continue to support this measure.

I. SB2445, SD2 RELATING TO PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS

The Board discussed this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to expand the authorized scope of practice for physician assistants.

The Board will continue to support this measure.

J. SB2282, SD1/HB2210 RELATING TO ABORTION CARE

The Board discussed these bills.

The purposes of these bills are to: (1) clarify that access to abortion care is inclusive of all pregnant people in the State; (2) repeal a criminal penalty for violations of certain abortion provisions; and (3) clarify that advanced practice registered nurses may provide abortion care.

Members were advised that HB2210 was not scheduled for hearing, thus, SB2282 is the vehicle.

The Board will continue to submit testimony appreciating the intent of the measure and providing comments.

K. SB2017, SD1 RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES

The Board discussed this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to repeal section 453-34(d), HRS, which limits licensure as an emergency medical technician 1 to

individuals whose practice is performed in a county with a population of 500,000 or greater.

Ms. Quiogue advised members that it had previously submitted testimony appreciating the intent of the bill and providing comments requesting that the preamble of the bill be amended. Based on these changes, it appears that the current version of the bill, it appears that the Board may support the new version of the bill.

By consensus, members voted to support this measure.

L. SB2026 RELATING TO THE EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES PERSONNEL LICENSURE INTERSTATE COMPACT

The Board discussed this bill.

The purpose of this bill is to enter Hawaii into the Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact to allow EMS personnel from other states to practice in Hawaii during a declared emergency.

Ms. Quiogue reminded the Board that, during the last Board meeting, the Senate Committee on Health deferred the measure. The Board voted to oppose this measure at its last meeting.

Federation of State Medical Boards:

A. FSMB Workgroup on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in Medical Regulation and Patient Care

Board members reviewed the FSMB's Workgroup on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusions Medical Regulation and Patient Care draft report. This report recommends meaningful and achievable steps that state medical boards, the FSMB, and its partners in medical education, regulation and practice may wish to consider as action items to eliminate racism and bias from health care delivery.

Chair Geimer-Flanders asked members whether they had any comments or questions regarding this draft report.

Ms. Quiogue advised the Board that Dr. Takanishi summarized and provided comments on the 31-page report for the Board's consideration. Ms. Quiogue asked Dr. Takanishi to summarize his recommendations for the Board's consideration.

Dr. Takanishi shared the following regarding the intent of the draft report:

- The FSMB formally adopt the FSMB Task Force's

Statement on Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in Medical Regulation and Health Care, April 15, 2021 (Appendix A) as official FSMB policy.

- State medical boards are encouraged to provide education and training to staff, board members, and licensees regarding cultural safety, humility, systemic racism and bias.
- State medical boards should provide information and education to patients about what constitutes discriminatory or otherwise inequitable care, and how they can work with their state medical board to address it.
- State medical boards are encouraged to consider the ways in which data is collected from licensees, complainants, and board members and staff in order to build the capacity to better understand diversity within these groups and identify disparities that may exist.
- State medical boards should consider ways of increasing their data-gathering and analytic capacity, through partnerships with government, academic institutions and the FSMB.
- In order to help mitigate biases among staff and board members, state medical boards should consider redacting potentially biasing categories of data in licensing processes, and about complainants and respondents during complaint review, investigative, disciplinary and enforcement processes, including gender, race, ethnicity, age, medical schools attended, years in practice and others.
- State medical boards should seek to increase the diversity of their board members to mirror the population they serve through: (1) outreach to underrepresented communities and (2) statutory language that sets minimum standards for diversity through the appointments process.

Dr. Takanishi supports this first iteration of the FSMB Workgroup on Diversity draft, which will undergo various revisions, with plans to ultimately present the final document to the Federation's House of Delegates next year.
