## Happy New Year and Renewal Year!

2026 is an even-numbered year and that means it is a renewal year. Please read the information below that will help you to renew ON-TIME and avoid license forfeiture.

- The Real Estate Commission's (REC) prescribed deadline for license renewal is November 30, 2026. This deadline applies to all salespersons, brokers, and entities. Online renewal may be done via your MyPVL account: [mypvl.dcca.hawaii.gov](http://mypvl.dcca.hawaii.gov) and will be available in mid-October.
- Renewal reminder notifications are scheduled to be mailed and emailed (to the email address associated with your MyPVL account) to licensees in October.
- Principal brokers and brokers-in-charge must complete their license renewal and continuing education (CE) requirements BEFORE ANY ASSOCIATED LICENSEE'S RENEWAL WILL BE PROCESSED. The real estate license for the brokerage and all branch offices must also be renewed BEFORE ANY ASSOCIATED LICENSEE'S RENEWAL WILL BE PROCESSED.
- Licensees should familiarize themselves with their MyPVL accounts. If you are unable to log into your account, you may contact Tyler Technologies at (808) 695-4620 for log-in assistance or click on "CONTACT SUPPORT" toward the bottom of your MyPVL log-in page.
- In addition to license renewal, your MyPVL account is where licensees will check their CE history and that CE credits that have been completed are reported by the CE provider(s). See the "Checking your Continuing Education History" article that appears in this publication for helpful information.
- 20 hours of CE must be completed by the November 30th renewal deadline to ensure your ON-TIME renewal. The 20 hours is comprised of the two core courses, 2025-2026 Part A and Part B. BOTH Part A and B must be completed in order to receive core course credit of 6 credit hours. That leaves 14 hours of CE elective courses which must be completed by the November 30, 2026, renewal deadline. If CEs are not completed by this renewal deadline, licensees jeopardize their license status come January 1, 2027, and will become involuntarily inactive. The November 30th deadline provides ample time for processing of renewal applications.
- If you answer "YES" to any of the questions on your renewal application, you will not be able to renew your license online. In this instance, the licensee will be prompted to print the renewal application and SUBMIT A HARD COPY BY MAIL or IN-PERSON. Renewals submitted by mail or in-person require additional time for processing.
- All real estate SALESPERSONS who received their license in the even-numbered year of the biennium, 2026, are NOT required to complete the 20 hours of continuing education (CE) to renew their license on a current and active status. THIS DOES NOT APPLY TO NEWLY LICENSED real estate BROKERS who receive their license in 2026.
- DO NOT CONFUSE your REAL ESTATE LICENSE with your TRADE ORGANIZATION BOARD MEMBERSHIP DUES.
- Prelicense Schools, Prelicense Instructors, Guest Lecturers, Continuing Education Providers, Continuing Education courses must also re-register/re-certify by November 30, 2026, to remain current and in compliance.

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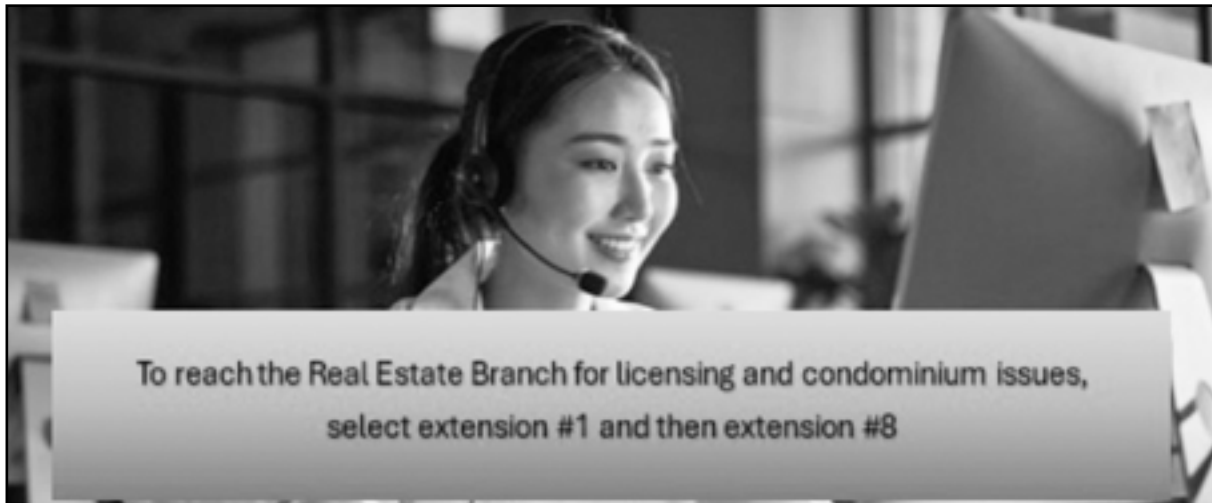
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## New DCCA Call Center and How to Reach the Real Estate Branch

The state of Hawai'i Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (DCCA) announces the launch of its new centralized toll-free phone number, 1-844-808-DCCA (3222), designed to make it easier and more efficient for residents, businesses, and consumers to access DCCA services. The new number brings multiple DCCA divisions onto a unified call center platform, improving call routing, case tracking, and consumer support. This effort is part of the department's broader modernization initiative to streamline how the public interacts with state services.

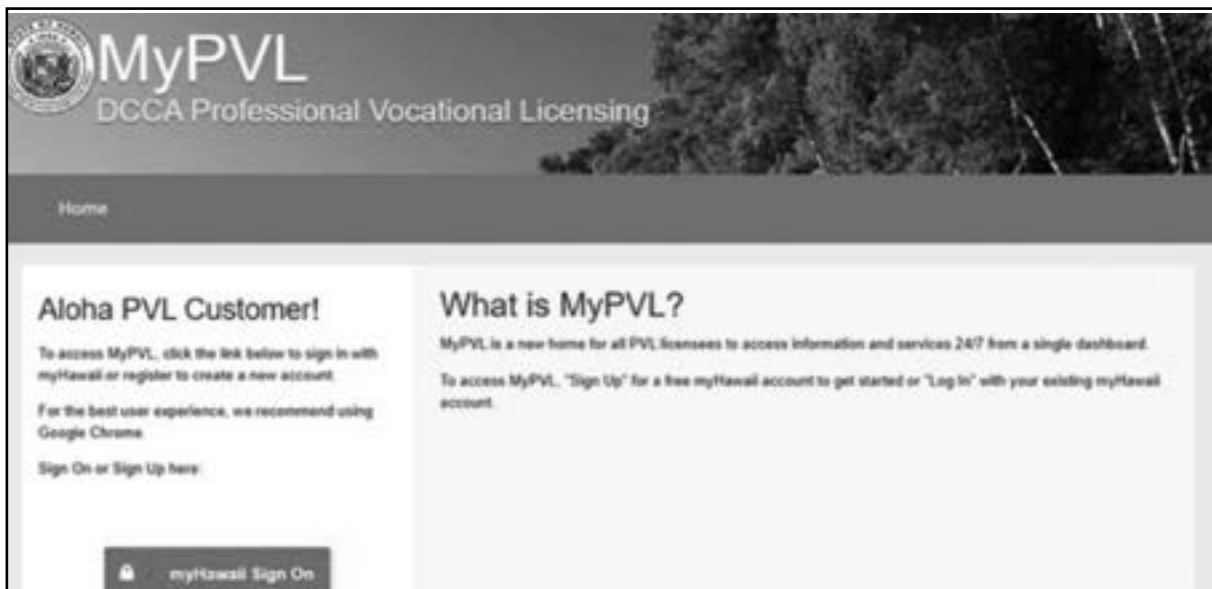
Callers who know which division they need may simply say the division name or wait for the menu prompt to select the division's short-cut number. To reach the Real Estate Branch, select extension #1 and then extension #8.

Wishing you good health, continued success, and much happiness,

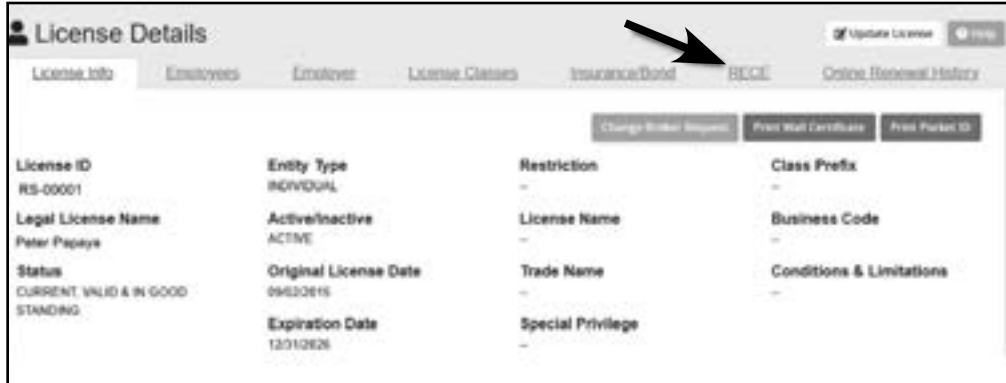

## Checking Your Continuing Education History (cont. from page 2)

Once logged into your account, click on your real estate license number and then click the "RECE" (Real Estate Continuing Education) tab. Finally, click on "View CE History" to view all the CE courses that have been completed and reported to the Commission. As a reminder, there is no longer a chart displaying the number of credits earned and required for the biennium. You must therefore track your course credits to ensure that you have completed 6 core credits and 14 elective credits. Do not procrastinate in fulfilling your continuing education requirement.



### Reasons why your CE course is not showing up in your CE history:

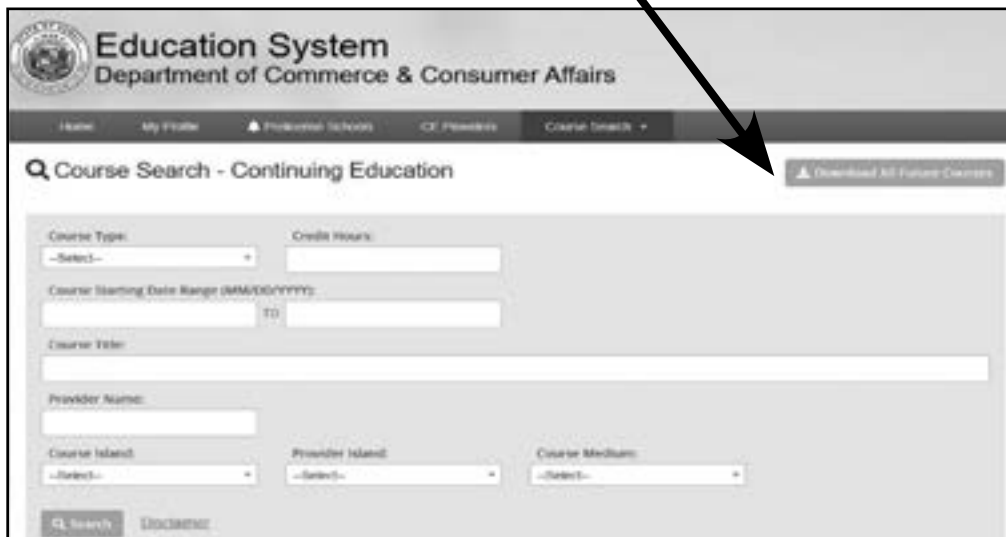
#### 1. Duplicate CEs:

Pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules, §16-99-95, "Duplicate continuing education hours. Except as provided by the commission or by this subchapter, a licensee shall not take a continuing education course for which the licensee has already received a certificate within two consecutive biennia." If you have repeated a CE course that you have taken in the previous biennium, you will not receive credit for the repeated CE course. Licensees are responsible for confirming their CE course(s) have not been duplicated and may track their previous courses via their MyPVL account and clicking on the RECE tab as noted above.

#### 2. 10-day reporting requirement:

Pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules §16-99-112(c), "Within ten days of the end of any continuing education course or completion of course offered by alternative delivery methods, the continuing education provider shall issue to each student having completed the course a certificate of completion of course as prescribed by the commission..." CE credits are only counted when they are reported in DCCA's Education System. Some CE Providers record course completion in their own systems and do not report it to DCCA. Therefore, if the courses do not appear in your MyPVL account, you must contact your CE Provider. This should be a good reminder to complete your CE courses sooner than later for a successful renewal.

At all relevant times herein, Respondent Option was a licensed real estate broker entity by the Real Estate Commission (the Commission). The license was issued on or about May 2, 2024. The license will expire or forfeit on or about December 31, 2026. At all relevant times herein, Respondent Campbell was a licensed real estate broker by the Commission. The license was issued on or about April 22, 2024. The license will expire or forfeit on or about December 31, 2026. At all relevant times herein, Respondent Campbell was the principal broker for Respondent Option. On or about January 4, 2025, RICO received an anonymous complaint about Respondents. In the course of the investigation, it was determined that one of the real estate salespersons listed on the team of Respondent Option, Angel Leolani Tadeo (Tadeo), was unlicensed. The license check of Tadeo revealed that her real estate salesperson's license expired on December 31, 2024, and was forfeited on January 1, 2025. Respondent Campbell told a RICO investigator that he was unaware that Tadeo's license expired and suspended all of Tadeo's real estate activity. Tadeo was notified of the lapse in her real estate license. Tadeo stated

that she submitted her license renewal prior to January 1, 2025, and believed that her license was renewed, as she did not receive any notifications that the renewal was unsuccessful. Tadeo was unaware that she was unlicensed. Tadeo immediately took steps to renew her license. On March 3, 2025, Tadeo's license was reactivated and expires on December 31, 2026. Between January 1, 2025, and February 27, 2025, Tadeo conducted two real estate transactions.

At all relevant times herein, Respondent was a licensed real estate salesperson by the Real Estate Commission (the Commission). The license was originally issued on or about January 11, 2022. On December 31, 2024, the license expired and was then forfeited on January 1, 2025. On March 3, 2025, the license was reactivated and will expire or forfeit on or about December 31, 2026. On or about January 4, 2025, RICO received an anonymous complaint about Option One Real Estate, LLC (Option One) and its principal broker, Jason Charles Campbell (Campbell). In the course of the investigation, it was determined that Respondent, who was listed as one of the real estate salespersons on the team of Option One, was unlicensed. The license check of Respondent revealed that her real estate salesperson's license expired on December 31, 2024, and was forfeited on January 1, 2025. Campbell told a RICO investigator that he was unaware that Respondent's license was expired and suspended all of the Respondent's real estate activity. Respondent was notified of the lapse in her real estate license. Respondent stated that she submitted her license renewal prior to January 1, 2025, and believed that her license was renewed,

as she did not receive any notifications that the renewal was unsuccessful. It was Respondent's first time renewing her license. Respondent was unaware that she was unlicensed. Respondent immediately took steps to renew her license. On March 3, 2025, Respondent's license was reactivated and expires on December 31, 2026. Between January 1, 2025, and February 27, 2025, Respondent engaged in real estate activities for two properties.

# Statutory/Rule Violations

**Settlement Agreement (Allegations/Sanction):** A Settlement Agreement may or may not include an admission that the Respondent violated licensing laws and/or rules on a case-by-case basis.

**Disciplinary Action (Factual Findings/Order):** The respondent is found to have violated the specific laws and rules cited, and the Commission approves the recommended order of the Hearings Officer.

- HRS §436B-19(16)      Employing, utilizing, or attempting to employ or utilize at any time any person not licensed under the licensing laws where licensure is required.
- HRS §467-1.6(a)      The principal broker shall have direct management and supervision of the brokerage firm and its real estate licensees.
- HRS §467-1.6(b)(5)      The principal broker shall be responsible for: Developing policies and procedures for the brokerage firm concerning the handling of real estate transactions and the conduct of the associated real estate licensees and other staff, including education and enforcement of the policies and procedures.
- HRS §467-1.6(b)(7)      The principal broker shall be responsible for: Ensuring that the licenses of all associated real estate licensees and the brokerage firm license are current and active;
- HRS §467-7      No person within the purview of this chapter shall act as real estate broker or real estate salesperson, or shall advertise, or assume to act as real estate broker or real estate salesperson without a license previously obtained under and in compliance with this chapter and the rules and regulations of the real estate commission.

## REAL ESTATE COMMISSION INFORMATIONAL NOTICE

### NEW LICENSE APPLICANTS, LICENSE RENEWAL AND CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENT

All real estate licenses must be renewed by the renewal application deadline, **November 30, 2026**. All real estate licenses expire at the end of each even-numbered year, regardless of the initial date of licensure. Submission of a complete renewal application, payment of fees, and for active licensees, completion of continuing education courses, are required by the renewal application deadline to ensure the successful renewal of licenses before January 1, 2027. Licenses not successfully renewed will be considered forfeited as of January 1, 2027, and the licensee will not be able to conduct real estate activity or receive compensation.

If you are renewing your license on an active status, you must fulfill the mandatory continuing education requirement **prior** to submitting your renewal application. For a new salesperson licensee with a new license issued in 2026, see below – SALESPERSON APPLICANTS and SALESPERSON LICENSEES. If you are not able to complete the continuing education requirement, your license may be renewed on an inactive status and you may not conduct real estate activity or receive compensation. There is a \$25.00 fee to change from inactive status to active status, in addition to completion of the continuing education requirement.

#### **SALESPERSON APPLICANTS and SALESPERSON LICENSEES:**

- If you apply for a new salesperson license before the end of 2026, you will have to pay license fees twice in 2026. In addition to the fees you pay for your new license, you will have to pay renewal fees to renew your license by November 30, 2026. Fees are not prorated and cover the cost of processing, reviewing, and decision on the application.

- All salesperson licensees must complete the continuing education requirement prior to the renewal application deadline to successfully renew on an active status, unless you were issued a new salesperson license during calendar year 2026 and renew your license by November 30, 2026. If you were issued a new salesperson license in calendar year 2026 and renew your license by the renewal application deadline, you will be deemed to have completed the equivalent to the continuing education requirement and will not have to complete the continuing education requirement for this license renewal.
- If your new salesperson license application deadline is on or after December 31, 2026, and you do not desire to be licensed as a salesperson in 2026, **and the licensing renewal application period is in effect**, you may submit your complete salesperson license application during the renewal application period and request that your new salesperson license be effective January 1, 2027. Please call for specific information on this procedure. The aforementioned continuing education equivalency will not be applicable if licensed in calendar year 2027.

### **BROKER APPLICANTS and BROKER LICENSEES:**

- All broker applicants and broker licensees must complete the continuing education requirement prior to the renewal application deadline in order to successfully renew their salesperson or broker license on an active status.
- If your broker license application deadline is on or after December 31, 2026, and you do not desire to be licensed as a broker in 2026, **and you received the renewal application for your salesperson license**, you may submit your complete broker license application during the renewal application period (must be received by November 30, 2026) and request that your salesperson license not be renewed and the new broker license be effective January 1, 2027. This procedure does not excuse completion of continuing education requirements for active licensees. Please call for specific information on this procedure.

### **DUPLICATE CEs:**

Pursuant to Hawaii Administrative Rules, §16-99-95, "Duplicate continuing education hours. Except as provided by the commission or by this subchapter, a licensee shall not take a continuing education course for which the licensee has already received a certificate within two consecutive biennia." If you have repeated a continuing education course that you have taken in the previous biennium, you will not receive credit for the repeated continuing education course. Licensees are responsible for confirming their continuing education course(s) have not been duplicated and may track their previous courses via their MyPVL account and clicking on the RECE (Real Estate Continuing Education) tab.

# CONDO HAWAII

## Condominium Law Update: Supreme Court Case, Frederick T. Caven, Jr. vs Certified Management, Inc. Associa Hawaii

Condominium associations have a legal obligation to provide significant number of documents to owners pursuant to §§514B-152 to 154.5, Hawai'i Revised Statutes ("HRS"). This Hawai'i Supreme Court case expands the type of documents that must now be provided at no cost via a download site.

This case stems from a condominium owner in the Regency at Poipu Kai Condominium Association, Frederick T. Caven, Jr., who brought an action against the association's managing agent, Associa Hawaii, over fees related to the Project Information Form RR105c ("Form RR105c") and a Statement of Account ("SOA"). These documents are generally part of the closing documents required during the sale of a condominium unit, cooperative, planned development community, or other homeowner organization property in a community association.

Caven filed suit arguing that Associa Hawaii unlawfully charged unit owners unreasonable and excessive fees for the documents that, as the managing agent of the association, it was required to maintain pursuant to chapter 514B, HRS. Associa countered by claiming that Form RR105c and the SOA were not subject to chapter 514B, HRS, and that the "no charge for electronic download" clause of §514B-154.5(e), HRS, applied only to associations and not to managing agents. This case went to an appellate court and eventually the Hawai'i Supreme Court.

The Supreme Court of Hawai'i, on September 5th, 2025, concluded that:

"Associa had a duty, pursuant to HRS §§ 514B-152 and -154.5 to make the Project Information Form RR105c and the Statement of Account for the Regency at Poipu Kai Association of Apartment Owners available to Caven, regardless of whether they are regularly maintained by the association or the managing agent. We further conclude that where a managing agent makes such documents available for download through an internet site, they must do so at no cost to the unit owner or the owner's authorized agent."

The Supreme Court of Hawai'i's ruling has significant implications on how condominium associations and their agents can provide and charge for documents, including Form RR105c and SOAs. Boards and their agents should immediately review their processes and fees to ensure compliance with this landmark decision.

Please note that this ruling does not apply outside of condominiums. Claims against the Poipu Kai Association, a planned community association, were dismissed as they did not fall under chapter 514B, HRS. The Regency at Poipu Kai Condominium Association is located within the Poipu Kai Association.
